Support Group meetings

Our October meeting was very informative and entertaining with Hamish Turnbull speaking about his Parkinson's diagnosis in 2016 and how he manages his symptoms and wellbeing. Hamish is a Scot by origin, moving down to the South East with his family and forging a very successful business in Scottish

luxury textiles. Prior to being diagnosed, Hamish had a passion for rugby and golf, so he used these two sports to his advantage, and alongside cycling, yoga, badminton and the occasional swim, these activities have become his wellness game-changers.

Through the above sports, Hamish met Charlie Appleyard, founder of **Sport Parkinson's** and alongside two other Directors, they have built up an amazing business, raising over £361K which



has gone towards research, £59K to individual grants and have reached over 5,000 participants through its events. Sport Parkinson's run events such as their Four Nations Golf Tournament, with 40 players, all of whom have Parkinson's, along with 20 celebrities and 20 sponsors – all culminating in a a couple of days of friendship, laughter and good fun golf. Other activities include their Try-Athlon, where visitors can try different sports, sporting equipment and remedial therapies. Walking Football and Walking Rugby are also key topics for Sports Parkinson's events, all of which bring in sponsorship income as well as theraputic opportunties for those with Parkinson's to stay active.



Our next meeting takes place on 20 November (1400–1530hs at the Woodhatch Centre) and we have Sue Mills from Parkinson's UK joining us. Sue runs the Parkinson's online shop and she will bring with her an array of useful everyday living aids for the group to sample. Sue will be joined by Jill Beaumont – our Parkinson's Local Advisor, so if you have any issues that you feel you wish to discuss with Jill, please come along to the meeting and have a chat with her over refreshments.

Largest ever Parkinson's research trial

We're proud to be supporting and co-funding the largest ever Parkinson's research trial, which has now started recruiting participants in London and Newcastle, with more than 40 research trial sites due to open across the UK over the next year. This is a new research trial which will start by testing 2 potential treatments that could slow or even stop Parkinson's getting worse.

The Edmond J Safra Accelerating Clinical Trials in Parkinson's (EJS ACT-PD) is a revolutionary research trial, aiming to save time and money when testing treatments that have the potential to stop or slow Parkinson's progression. It will do this by testing multiple treatments at once, in a trial format known as a multi-arm, multi-stage, or MAMS.


Letter Sudoku:
